Minutes

1. Apologies for absence.

2. Declarations of members' interests in Items on the agenda.

3. Request for bus shelter – Kingsmead Road, Loudwater

Members agreed that the provision of a bus shelter at the suggested location would be to the benefit of residents and APPROVED the design, or similar. As the shelter was not budgeted for in 2012/13 members INSTRUCTED that the clerk seek contributions from interested bodies to meet or help off-set the cost.

4. Benches and bins

Members NOTED the report and AGREED that School Green be added to the site visits in July prior to considering further the proposal of the FHRA to move the two benches into the centre of the site.

5. Cemeteries, war memorials and closed churchyards

Members NOTED the reports and AGREED that, subject to the approval of the PCC, a plaque be affixed to one of the newly rebuilt gateway piers at St Margaret's recognising that the cost was funded by the Penn & Tylers Green Residents Society.

6. Footpaths and bridleways

Members NOTED the reports and AGREED that £2,000 from the committee's Third-party Working budget be contributed towards work being undertaken by the Bucks CC Rights of Way Team to provide a new circular bridleway in Kingswood,

7. Signage

Members NOTED the reports and AGREED that while at School Green in July they view the alternative locations for the council's noticeboard being requested by the FHRA as part of their replanting of the shrub border to provide a Jubilee Garden. The Association, quite understandably, would only wish to obtain costs and seek funding once the council has indicated that it is minded to approve their re-locating the noticeboard.

Members considered alternative materials and designs for new signs and noticeboards. Members were of the opinion that where possible we feature 'country-style' timber signs, similar to those currently used by us.

8. Questions from council members and the public

There were no questions.

9. Accounts for payment.

The list of accounts for payment was approved, the list to be attached to the minutes of the meeting.
